Transfusions end up deadly for hundreds

Blood transfusions meant to help save lives have instead ended in the deaths of hundreds of hospital patients across the country, Newsday reported. Overall, at least 441 patients died between 1995 and 2001 following transfusions, a Newsday investigation found. Newsday's examination of government records obtained through Preedom of Information Act requests found two deaths in Georgia -one in Athens and one in Macon. No details were available. At least 78 of the deaths reported to the Food and Drug Administration occurred after hospital workers gave patients the wrong type of blood.
